Creative Writing Samples

Please include samples of your creative writing

- 10-15 pages of prose (fiction or personal essay)
- or 5-10 poems
- or 12-17 pages of combination of prose and poetry

Letter of Recommendation

A letter of recommendation is required from applicant's high school English teacher or creative writing professor. This letter should be sent by the recommending teacher directly to our office. If electronic, the recommending instructor should send as an attachment to: tessa_hauglid@byu.edu.

Interview

Once the Clark Creative Writing Scholarship Committee has read what is submitted, they may invite an applicant to a brief personal interview.
